


Just for the record--WD-40 IS NOT CONSIDERED A LUBRICANT-It's a penetrant--It will loosen rusty crap-help loosen stuck bolts ect.. it's lubricating properties are temporary--WD-40 will remove the lubricating properties of whatever other lubes have been used--The solvents dry them out-

Use something simple like Superlube, break free, a simple machine oil (sewing machine oil-gun oil ect..) Plus, wd-40 stinks--as does break free--but break free is far superior-

If you have any sort of light oil--it should work--I use superlube on all little things like straplocks, fly reels, door latches ect..

You can pick up a tube of [superlube](#) for 2-3 bucks and it will last for years-

I have no dog in the lubrication fight but I have worked in an industry that relies heavily on lubricants and I have learned a lot about them--
