Danger: Causes skin irritation. Causes serious eye damage. Suspected of damaging fertility or the unborn child. Obtain special instructions before use. Do not handle until all safety precautions have been read and understood. Wash hands thoroughly after handling. Wear eye protection and protective gloves.

IF in eyes: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Immediately call a POISON CENTER or doctor.

IF on skin: Wash with plenty of soap and water. If skin irritation occurs: Get medical advice/attention. Take off contaminated clothing and wash it before reuse

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SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES
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Eye: Rinse thoroughly with water for at least 15 minutes, holding the eye lids open to be sure the material is washed out. Get immediate medical attention.

Skin: Remove contaminated clothing. Wash contact area thoroughly with soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation persists. Launder clothing before re-use.

Inhalation: Remove victim to fresh air. If breathing is difficult or irritation develops, get medical attention.

Ingestion: Rinse mouth with water. Do not induce vomiting unless directed to do so by medical personnel. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious or drowsy person. Get medical attention.

Most important symptoms and effects, acute and delayed: Causes severe eye irritation. Permanent eye damage is possible. Causes skin irritation. Inhalation of mist may cause upper respiratory tract irritation. Ingestion may cause gastrointestinal irritation, nausea, vomiting or diarrhea. Suspected of damaging fertility or the unborn child.

Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment, if needed: Immediate medical attention is required for eye contact.

SECTION 5: FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Suitable (and Unsuitable) Extinguishing Media: Use water fog, carbon dioxide, dry chemical or foam.

Specific Hazards Arising from the Chemical: Product is not flammable but will burn under fire conditions. Combustion may produce oxides of carbon, phosphorus and nitrogen and unidentified organic compounds.

Special Protective Equipment and Precautions for Fire-fighters: Wear NIOSH approved positive pressure, self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing. Cool fire exposed containers with water.

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal precautions, Protective equipment, and Emergency procedures: Wear appropriate protective clothing to avoid eye and skin contact as described in Section 8. Caution – slip hazard from spilled material.

Environmental precautions: Report spills and releases as required to appropriate authorities.

Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning up: Cover with an inert absorbent material and collect into an appropriate container for disposal. After removal, wash contaminated area thoroughly with soap and water.

SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

Precautions for Safe Handling: Do not get in eyes. Avoid contact with skin and clothing. Avoid breathing aerosols and mists. Use with adequate ventilation. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after use. Keep containers closed when not in use. Remove contaminated clothing immediately.

Conditions for Safe Storage, Including any Incompatibilities: Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated location away from oxidizing agents and other incompatible materials.
