## Danger!



Extremely Flammable aerosol. Pressurized container; May burst if heated.

Causes skin irritation. May cause drowsiness or dizziness. Suspected of damaging fertility.

May cause damage to the nervous system through prolonged or repeated exposure. May be fatal if swallowed and enters airways.

Keep away from heat, hot surfaces, sparks, open flames, and other ignition sources. No smoking.

Do not spray on an open flame or other ignition source. Do not pierce or burn, even after use.

Obtain special instructions before use. Do not use until all safety precautions have been read and understood. Do not breathe vapors or spray. Wash hands thoroughly after handling. Use only outdoors or in a well-ventilated area. Wear protective gloves.

IF inhaled: Remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing. Call a poison center or doctor if you feel unwell.

IF SWALLOWED: Immediately call a POISON CENTER. Do NOT induce vomiting.

IF on skin: wash with plenty of soap and water. If skin irritation occurs: Get medical attention. Take off contaminated clothing and wash it before reuse.



IF exposed or concerned: Get medical attention.

Protect from sunlight. Do not expose to temperatures exceeding 50°C/122°F. Store in a well-ventilated place. Store locked up.

Dispose of contents and container in accordance with local and national regulations.

## **SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES**

**Eye:** Rinse thoroughly with water for several minutes, while holding the eye lids open to be sure the material is washed out. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists.

**Skin:** Remove contaminated clothing. Wash contact area thoroughly with soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation persists. Launder clothing before re-use.

Inhalation: Remove victim to fresh air. Get medical attention if symptoms persist.

**Ingestion:** Ingestion is an unlikely route of exposure for aerosol products. If ingestion of the concentrate occurs, DO NOT induce vomiting. Keep the victim calm and warm. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious or drowsy person. If vomiting occurs spontaneously, keep head below hips to prevent aspiration into the lungs. Get immediate medical attention.

**Most important symptoms and effects, acute and delayed:** Causes skin irritation. May cause mild eye irritation. Harmful or fatal if swallowed. Aspiration into the lungs during ingestion or vomiting may cause lung damage. Inhalation may cause drowsiness, dizziness and other nervous system effects. Prolonged exposure may damage the nervous system. Suspected of damaging fertility.

**Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment, if needed:** If swallowed, get immediate medical attention.

## **SECTION 5: FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES**

**Suitable (and Unsuitable) Extinguishing Media:** Use carbon dioxide, dry chemical or foam. Water may be ineffective but can be used to cool containers and structures.

**Specific Hazards Arising from the Chemical:** Extremely flammable aerosol. Contents under pressure. Keep away from heat and open flames. Container may rupture or explode in the heat of a fire. Prolonged exposure to temperatures above 120°F may cause cans to burst. Never use welding or cutting torch on or near containers (even empty) because product can ignite explosively. Vapors are heavier than air and may travel along surfaces to remote ignition sources and flash back. Combustion products may be hazardous: Oxides of carbon, organic compounds, smoke and fumes.

**Special Protective Equipment and Precautions for Fire-fighters:** Wear NIOSH approved positive pressure, self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing. Cool fire exposed containers with water. Use shielding to protect against bursting containers.



#### SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

**Personal precautions, Protective equipment, and Emergency procedures:** Wear appropriate protective clothing to avoid eye and skin contact. Remove all ignition sources such as open flames, spark producing equipment, pilot lights, etc. Ventilate the area.

**Environmental precautions:** Avoid release to the environment. Report spills and releases as required to appropriate authorities.

Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning up: Place leaking can in an open pail or pan in a well-ventilated area until the pressure has been released. Cover liquid with an inert absorbent material and collect into an appropriate container for disposal.

## **SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE**

**Precautions for Safe Handling:** Avoid breathing vapors, aerosols and mists. Use with adequate ventilation. Avoid contact with the eyes, skin and clothing. Wash exposed skin thoroughly with soap and water after use. Keep product away from heat, sparks, flames and all other sources of ignition. No smoking in storage or use areas. Do not cut, braze, solder, grind or weld on or near containers. Contents under pressure. Do not puncture, crush or incinerate containers, even when empty. Keep out of the reach of children.

**Conditions for Safe Storage, Including any Incompatibilities:** Store in a cool, well-ventilated area at temperatures below 120°F. Do not store in direct sunlight. Store as a Level 3 aerosol.

## **Personal Protective Equipment:**

**Respiratory Protection:** Not required under normal conditions. If the exposure levels are exceeded, a NIOSH approved respirator with organic vapor cartridges may be used. For higher exposures, a supplied air respirator may be required. Respirator selection and use should be based on contaminant type, form and concentration. Follow OSHA 1910.134, ANSI Z88.2 and good Industrial Hygiene practice.

Hand protection: Impervious gloves are recommended when needed to avoid skin contact.

Eye Protection: Chemical safety goggles recommended.
